Mastitis course

Two-day course, 29–30 September 2006. Location: GD Deventer, The Netherlands.

The goal of the course is to give the students an overview of all aspects involved in the detection, diagnosis and management factors affecting the disease and its outcome.

During the course, many aspects of bovine mastitis will be presented. These include epidemiology, anatomy and pathology, immunology, bacteriology, but also subjects like the influence of the milking machine, treatment of mastitis, risk factors on farms, and breeding.

The maximum number of participants will be 20. Participants are assumed to have a basic understanding of production diseases in the dairy cattle husbandry and an interest to learn more about mastitis.

During the evening the program is more informal and will leave plenty of time for discussion.

The course is organised by Henk Hogeveen of the Business Economics Group. One of the speakers will be Professor Ynte Schukken, world-known mastitis specialist from Cornell University.
